1. Communication Design



Graphic Designer

A graphic designer is a professional within the graphic design and graphic arts industry. A graphic designer creates the graphics primarily for published, printed, or electronic media, such as brochures and advertising.



User Experience (UX) Designer

UX (user experience) design is the process of designing products and experiences that are efficient, effective, and even delightful for users.



User Interface (UI) Designer

User interface (UI) design is the process designers use to build interfaces in software or computerized devices, focusing on looks or style.



Communication Designer

A communication designer is a professional who uses visual elements to deliver information to an audience. To attract new consumers or spread awareness about a topic, communication designers oversee promotional campaigns.

2. Animation Design



Modeller

Modellers or model makers build the digital or physical versions of everything that is seen on screen in an animation. They translate concept art, character designs and environment designs into models ready to be animated. They work in-house at an animation studio.



Character Animator

A character animator is a specialization of a 3D animator. They breathe life into 3D characters, adding nuance and personality through their movements, gestures, facial expressions, and how they interact (and react) with their environment and other characters.



Multimedia Artist

Multimedia artists create two- and three-dimensional models, images that appear to move, and visual effects for television, movies, video games, and other forms of media.



Animator


An animator produces multiple images in 2D & 3D called frames, which when sequenced together create an illusion of movement - this is known as animation. The images can be made up of digital or hand-drawn pictures, models or puppets.

3. Game Design



Board Game Designer

As a board game designer, you'll bring ideas, build prototypes, create interactive narration and develop the game's mechanics. You'll design systems that are easily maintainable, expandable and comfortable to use, while injecting fun into the user experience.



Video Game Designer

A video game designer imagines almost everything about a game, including its plots, characters, visual designs, and layouts. Designers meet with different teams and create a cohesive vision.

4. Textile & Fashion Design



Fashion Designer

Fashion design is the art of applying design, aesthetics, clothing construction and natural beauty to clothing and its accessories.



Fashion Stylist

Fashion stylists work for individuals, fashion houses and clothing brands.

Their main responsibilities include providing fashion advice; choosing and co-ordinating outfits for models in photo shoots or actors in television and film.



Knitwear Designer

A Knitwear Design course deals with wools, yarns and other materials needed for making final knitted apparel. They learn how to use technology, machines and tools in producing specific designs and garments.



Fashion Journalist/Fashion Blogger

Fashion journalists focus mostly on trends and events, and maintain relationships with designers and stylists. A fashion journalist has knowledge of fashion history, and stays up to date on industry trends.



Textile Designer

A Web designer is someone who prepares content for the Web. This role is mainly related to the styling and layout of pages with content, including text and images.



Visual Merchandiser

Visual Merchandisers present, arrange and display items in stores and shop windows, that is, in crucial places where customers get to see, pick and buy products.

5. Interior Design



Interior Designer

Interior designers make indoor spaces functional, safe, and beautiful by determining space requirements and selecting essential and decorative items, such as colors, lighting, and materials.



Exhibition Designer

An exhibition designer is a professional who creates fixtures and display stands for events such as large public exhibitions, conferences, trade shows and temporary displays for businesses, museums, libraries and art galleries.



Set Designer

The set decorator is responsible for fulfilling the production designer's vision via the "set dressing" or decor elements within a set: lighting, art, furniture, collectibles, drapery, floor coverings, technology, garden sculptures, streetlamps, etc.



Lighting Designer


Lighting design is a process that is part of any architectural and interior design project where the designer has to know all the important aspects of lighting that can influence a space.

6. Jewellery Design




Jewellery Designer

Jewelry designers work with precious metals, diamonds, beads and gemstones to create wearable pieces of art. A jewelry designer may create one-of-a-kind pieces for high-end jewelers or an entire line for a mass-market fashion designer.



Jewellery Retoucher

It involves common enhancements such as color correction, background removal, and blemish removal, among many others. Jewelry retouching services are commonly availed by jewelers for commercial purposes.



Jewellery Setter

Setters specialise in fixing precious and semi-precious gemstones into various items of jewellery, accessories and silverware using a range of setting and carving techniques.



Gemologist

The work responsibilities of gemologists include identifying, grading, and appraising gemstones. A Gemologist can easily identify the gemstone and its variety.

7. Ceramic Design



Ceramic Designer

Ceramic artists shape, form, and mold artworks out of clay, often using a potters wheel and other tools. They glaze and fire pieces in kilns, which are large, special furnaces that dry and harden the clay.



Glass Designer

Glass designer is an expert who designs different materials such as pottery, cookware, tableware, decorative glasses, and various other items using glass.

8. Accessories Design



Leather Accessory Designer

A leather accessory designer creates accessories, such as bags, pouches belts out of the leather material. A leather designer generally assists other design teams by observing and participating in creating a leather accessory collection.



Men's Accessory Designer

Men accessory designers work in the fashion industry creating accessories such as wallets, belts, scarves, mufflers and other fashion items that complement various attires.



Footwear/Shoe Designer

Shoe or footwear designers come under the category of fashion designers who specialise in creating original footwear. They sketch design and create shoes using particular materials and patterns.



Women's Accessory Designer

Women accessory designers work in the fashion industry creating accessories such as bags, belts, scarves, and other fashion items that complement various attires.

9. Furniture Design



Furniture & Crafts Designer

Furniture & crafts designer create prototypes and models for production they may be required to use Computer-Aided Design(CAD) programs to create and develop their models.



Furniture Conservator/Restorer

A Furniture conservator/restorer will be responsible for restoring and conserving modern and antique furniture. They might also have to restore, rebuild and repair different types of furniture.

10. Product Design



Product Designer

A product designer shall be asked to define the specifications of the product and create, print or digital drawing for them. They may also have to analyze the scope of a product in the market.
