Dietitian

Dietitians understand the ways that food and drink affect the body. They help people who are already healthy stay well-nourished.



Nutritionist

Nutritionists help people by advising them on food choices, facilitating better health by making them better informed. Begin your path to a career as a nutritionist by completing a university degree in a field such as nutrition or food sciences.



Nurse Manager

To be a nurse manager, you must have a registered nursing license and several years of experience in the profession. A nurse manager supervises a hospital or clinic's nursing unit.



Clinical Administrator

A recognised medical qualification is essential for a career in clinical administration. The job is to provide professional leadership to medical staff, ensuring that all medical standards are complied with.



Hospital Administration

Hospital administrators do general duties to ensure the efficient delivery of medical and other services to patients. Job opportunities include both higher level roles and positions appropriate for those beginning their careers.



Medical Records Administrator

Medical records administrators generally work in healthcare settings, carrying out duties such as maintaining patient records, responding to queries, billing, and data entry.



Medical Secretary

If you're highly organised and have good communication and time management skills, a career as a medical secretary might be right for you. Start gaining experience as soon as possible in order to build up your skills and industry knowledge.



Medical Program Manager

Medical program managers work within medical facilities, supervising a specific department or managing patient records systems. They oversee personnel and resource management, as well as hospital policies.



Audiologist

The job is to understand, identify and treat hearing disorders. You assist patients by overseeing non-medical rehabilitation and management of hearing loss and related communication disorders.



Optometrist

Optometrists identify vision problems by performing examinations. They also prescribe treatments to deal with these issues. Some of the treatment options available include the prescription of eye glasses, a variety of optical aids, vision therapy, and medicated eye drops.



Podiatrist

As a podiatrist, you diagnose and treat foot abnormalities. You also help to prevent them, partly by providing education to patients about foot health. To be successful in this field, you'll need to be able to work independently and be enthusiastic with patients about providing excellent foot care.



Speech Pathologist

If you have excellent listening and speaking skills as well as empathy and perceptiveness, a career as a speech pathologist is something you might like to consider.



Veterinarian

A veterinarian (vet), also known as a veterinary surgeon or veterinary physician, is a medical professional who practices veterinary medicine.



Veterinary Nurse

If you love animals but don't think being a veterinarian would be right for you, veterinary nursing is an alternative path to consider. In this career, you'll probably work in an animal hospital or veterinary practice.



Acupuncturist

Acupuncture is an ancient practice and an important treatment technique in Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM). It focuses on the concept of Qi (vital or life energy).



OT Technician

An operation theatre technician is a person who looks after all the work and management of the operation theatre which includes managing the patients in & out of operation theatre, looking after all the surgical instruments, their sterilization, arrangement of operation theatre table and dressing table etc.



Naturopath

Naturopaths use natural therapies to support the body in healing itself. They can practice a variety of natural therapies including, for example, herbal medicine, nutrition, massage, homeopathy, and iridology.



Dental Assistant

They help dentists in dealing with medical and dental emergencies. They keep track of medication in patient files. By sterilizing and disinfecting equipment, setting up instrument trays, packing supplies, and helping in dental operations, dental assistants assist in infection prevention.



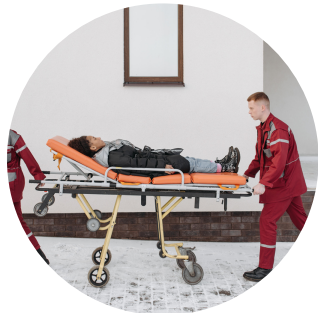
Dental Hygienist

Dental hygienists are healthcare professionals. An integral part of any dental team, they use not only therapeutic but also preventive and educational methods to help ensure oral health and address oral diseases.



Dentist

Some of your duties will include carrying out examinations, taking patient x-rays, doing dental restoration, preparing and fitting bridges, crowns, and dentures, and speaking with patients about oral health.



Paramedic

Paramedics provide urgent medical attention in emergency situations, transporting patients to the hospital. The qualifications and experience needed depend on the employer and location, and individual states have their own requirements.



Physician

Physician Assistant (PA)

The role and job title of Physician Assistant (also sometimes referred to as Physician Associate). It's believed that there will be a growing number of these professionals integrated in the country's healthcare system in the future.



Medical Research Scientist

Investigating medical ailments and improving treatments is the job of medical research scientists. They require analytical skills, the ability to work independently and as part of a team, and a highly developed capacity for focus and concentration.



Research Assistant

Research assistants in medical science work under the direction of researchers in charge of the lab or project in question. Many research assistant positions are part-time and/or fixed-term (contract) appointments.



Research Officer

As a research officer, you could be doing laboratory research or perhaps research on communities and public health. It depends on the specific niche within healthcare sector.



Diversional Therapist

Diversional therapists design and facilitate recreation and leisure programs to promote the emotional, social, spiritual, psychological, and physical wellbeing of individuals. There are many different workplaces in which diversional therapists can be found.



Psychiatrist

As a psychiatrist, you diagnose and treat behavioural, emotional, and mental disorders. Examples of illnesses you'd treat could include bipolar disorder, depression, anxiety disorders, personality disorders, and schizophrenia.



Psychologist

If you're a caring and empathetic person with insight into human behavior, becoming a psychologist might be a viable career option. Psychologists world wide are licensed and regulated.



Mental Health Nurse

To be a Mental Health Nurse (MHN), you first need to be an Enrolled Nurse or a Registered Nurse. If you're still a student in a nursing program, you could ask to do a placement in a Mental Health Nursing setting.



Medical Imaging Technologist

Medical imaging technologists produce radiographic images through the use of X-rays and other kinds of imaging equipment. As such, they are essential professionals in disease and injury diagnosis and management.



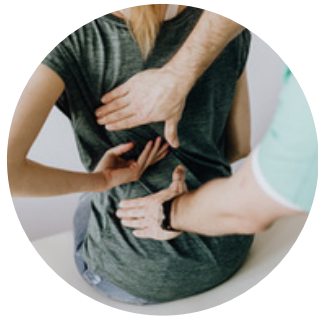
Hospital Pharmacist

Hospital pharmacists are responsible for making sure that prescribed medications in a hospital setting are administered safely and effectively.



Pharmacy Technician

Pharmacy technicians assist in the preparation and dispensing of medicines. Some duties include receiving prescriptions from pharmacists.



Chiropractor

Chiropractors (also known as Doctors of Chiropractic) focus on the relationship between the spine and nervous system. They believe that understanding both structure and function are instrumental to ensuring the overall health of their patients.



Massage Therapist

Massage therapists carry out therapeutic massage and body treatments for several purposes, including health, relaxation, fitness, and remedial.



Anaesthetic Technologist

Anaesthetic technologists provide assistance to anaesthetists, preparing the equipment and environment needed for anaesthetists to ensure environmental temperature control and monitoring.



Physiotherapist

Physiotherapists treat patients who have physical problems, such as disability and injury. As a physiotherapist, you could treat both adults and children.



Therapy Assistant

Therapy assistants work under the direction of a physiotherapist or occupational therapist. A Certificate III in Allied Health Assistance will help you begin in this career.



Occupational Health and Safety Advisor

Occupational health and safety advisors are valued members of the workplace, essential for ensuring that health and safety best practices are known and adhered to.



Medical Laboratory Technician

Successful medical laboratory technicians are detail-oriented, curious, and conscientious. You should have strong problem-solving skills and empathy for others.



Anesthesiologist

Anesthesiologists are advanced nurses who induce anesthesia to patients during invasive therapeutic, diagnostic, and surgical procedures.



Oral & Maxillofacial Surgeon

Oral & Maxillofacial Surgeons are expert dentists trained to perform surgeries on the face, mouth, and jaws. They can treat a host of diseases, defects, and injuries in the face, jaws, head, neck, and oral/maxillofacial region.



Gynecologist

Gynaecologists are physicians who specialize in the female reproductive system and the medical care of women. They can either serve as primary care providers for women's medical issues or as consultants to other physicians



Pediatrician

Pediatricians specialize in dealing with the health and development of children. They diagnose, treat, and counsel children till they reach their teenage.



Oncologist

Oncologists are cancer specialists who study, diagnose, and treat various forms of cancer.



Radiation Therapists

Radiation therapists are usually a part of the Oncology team, including oncologists, physicists, and nurses who collaborate to treat cancer patients of different stages.



Ophthalmologist

Ophthalmologists are doctors specializing in eye and vision care. They differ from optometrists and opticians in their training and specialization level and also in what they can diagnose and treat.



Orthopedic Doctor

Orthopedic doctors specialize in caring for and treating the human musculoskeletal system, including bones, joints, ligaments, nerves, and tendons.



Medical Receptionist

A Medical Receptionist's duties and responsibilities include greeting visitors, helping them navigate through doctor's office, In addition, they maintain doctor's calendars for appointments, sort mail, make copies.



ICU Staff Nurse

ICU nurses commonly provide care to patients suffering from cardiac disease, brain injuries, accident victims, and patients recovering from complex surgeries that need frequently nursing care.



NICU Staff Nurse

Provide nursing care to infants in neonatal intensive care unit setting. Provide focused care to babies born prematurely in NICU care setting. Provide intensive nursing care to seriously ill patients. Interact with parents in providing nursing care to babies.



Medical Superintendent

A medical superintendent supervises daily functions at a health care facility, with the assistance of support staff. This includes budgeting, patient care, and human resources needs.



Consultant Radiology

A Consultant Radiologist is a specialist physician who uses different medical imaging technologies to diagnose the causes of human diseases and ailments.



Consultant Nephrology

Doctors in renal medicine (also known as nephrologists) diagnose and treat diseases of the kidneys. This could include inherited conditions like polycystic kidney disease (where cysts grow in both kidneys), auto-immune disorders (where the body attacks its own tissues) and kidney tumours.



ICU Medical Officer

Medical officers are senior physicians who manage all aspects related to patient care within their departments. They oversee daily operations, serve as clinical advisors, and investigate any problems that may arise. They also contribute to medical research programs and supervise clinical trials.



Pharmacy Incharge

Oversees the operations of the pharmacy department. Make sure that customers are prescribed the correct medicine. Ensure the pharmacy complies with federal and state regulations.



Yoga Therapist

The therapeutic benefit comes in when a yoga therapist crafts a class designed to create balance through posture, breathing and meditation techniques. Together, those three tools can trigger the relaxation response — the antidote to your body's stress response — and that's where the real healing happens.



Cosmetic Surgeon

A plastic cosmetic surgeon is a specialist plastic surgeon who has mastered the art of performing exclusively cosmetic surgery as well. They can do reconstructive surgeries as well as reshaping procedures as well.



ENT

A doctor who has special training in diagnosing and treating diseases of the ear, nose, and throat. Also called otolaryngologist.



Neurology And Neurosurgeon

The difference is that neurosurgeons deal with surgical issues related to the brain and spine, whereas neurologists often deal more with nonsurgical, degenerative issues related to neurological problems.



Bariatric Surgeon

A bariatric surgeon is a surgeon who specializes in performing weight loss surgeries to help lose excess weight from the body.



Forensic Pathologist

A forensic pathologist is an expert who has the specialized knowledge to determine the cause of death, injury and wound of a person.
